Like with opaque painting mediums, colors can be layered over previous applications, either by covering them completely, or by allowing bits of color to show through.

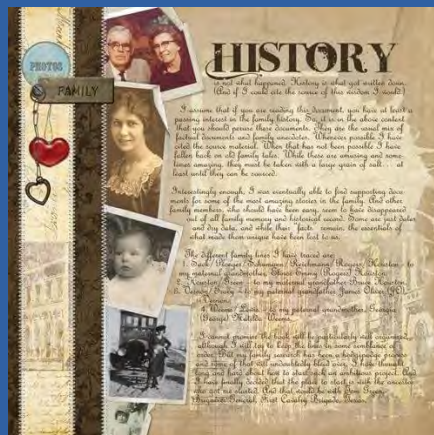
APBC ART SALON NEWS

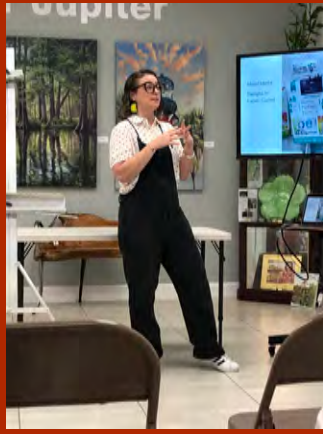

As we continue to pursue our efforts with the Town of Lake Park to get gallery space there, we are also looking at other venues to show the work of our artists. We have been offered an opportunity by the Studio for the Visual Arts in Tequesta to hold several events there. Our Summer, 2022 Exhibition was the largest we have had and was very successful in terms of attendance and sales. The Studio and VIP members Susan and Ed Munoz continue to be very generous, but we need to pay our fair share of gallery expenses also. We have not raised our membership fees since the beginning of our founding. In fact, they were lowered early on so that more artists could exhibit their work. We want to continue that mission.

All memberships are due to renew in January, unless you joined later in this year. We urge members to renew early and to upgrade their level of membership if they are financially able. 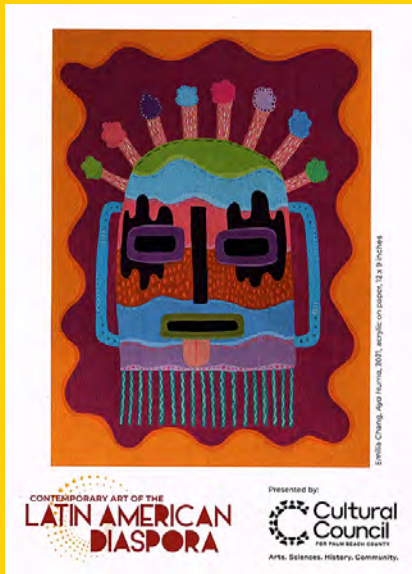

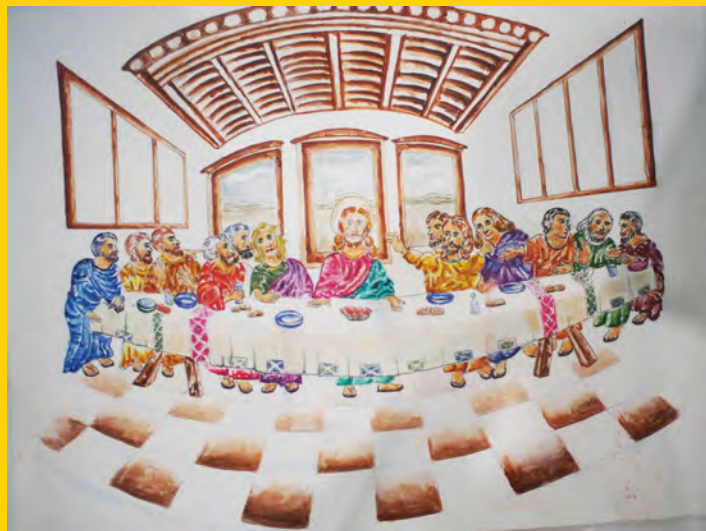
HOLIDAY SHOW AND SALE

PHOTOSHOP FUNDAMENTALS

I'm so excited to announce that I will be once again teaching **Photoshop Fundamentals** at Palm Beach State College in Lake Worth; a ***beginner's non-credit class tailored to adult students***. The class runs for 6 weeks, Monday nights, 6-9 p.m. beginning Oct. 31 through Dec. 5.

Photoshop® is truly the 800-pound gorilla of the graphics world, with a very deep and broad interface. We start at the beginning, even if you have no Photoshop experience, and walk you through the basics. Many of these elementary photo-imaging principles apply both to Photoshop and Photoshop Elements, an excellent program for the hobbyist. It is recommended however, that you have a basic understanding of computing and your operating system, either Windows or Mac, first.

The beginnings topics I cover include The Work Area, Tools, Navigating, Using the Bridge (File Browser), Making Selections, (Tools & Methods), Layer Basics, Layer Styles (FX), Resolution, Resizing, File Size, Image Adjustments & Basic Photo Corrections.

After the basics, I continue with topics such as Retouching & Repairing Photos, Masks, Compositing, Painting, Editing, Shapes, Type, Filters, Special Effects, Saving for Web and Print.

One of the cornerstones of my classes is my belief that they must be tailored to the needs and goals of the students. Many adults come to these classes with tremendous variation in their experience and skills; it is my primary job to first ascertain what my students need and how best to proceed to attain their goals.

I strive to promote a low pressure and welcoming atmosphere, geared to the needs and goals of adult students. I use discussions, demonstrations, videos, handouts, and other materials to demystify Photoshop and help students to discover its endless creative possibilities for personal expression.

**Reflective Statement on painting title:
Impressions of Halloween
by Al Rojas**

I began this piece, as something fun to do for the Fall, impressions of childhood Halloweens, especially the very early ones, when everything was so new, and any little story among friends became an urban legend. These are the most precious of our impressions and go on to become lifelong memories.

In the 70's, I took a class on stained glass and made one successful work, using glass that was very "rich," thick, and resembling acrylic impasto. The image was intended to be an old town on a hillside – something easy to make, with not too many difficult cuts and sharp angles. After it was finished, one of my classmates commented that it looked more like a cemetery.

In the 80's, after I had gained some control of my acrylic techniques, I used the same image to make a watercolor/acrylic version and tried to make it look more like a cemetery (ref. image 80s cemetery).

In this third attempt, using the computer and making impressions of some of the structures from the second (80's) image, I tried to capture the liquid walls of the initial structures, including some of the features of the glass used in the original work. Then I got a bit carried away and added quite a number of layers from bits and pieces I had laying in my memory bin.

I can't say this image is an accurate memory of the Halloweens of my youth, but the memory has a tendency to alter first impressions, and the years in between burden the mind with excess baggage. I hope your recollections are just as memorable and stimulated by this work, or at least got you remembering those cold, blue moon nights, just as you met your friends to go trick or treating.



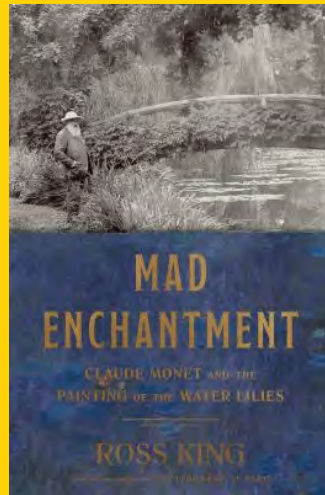

[Mad Enchantment](#) by Ross King

Among all of Monet's creations, the paintings of the water lilies in his garden at Giverny are most famous. Monet himself intended them to provide "an asylum of peaceful meditation." Monet's beautiful canvases belie the intense frustration he experienced at the difficulties of capturing the fugitive effects of light, water, and color. They also reflect the terrible personal torments Monet suffered in the last dozen years of his life.

Ross King's magisterial chronicle tells the full story behind the creation of the Water Lilies, as the horrors of World War I came ever closer to Paris and Giverny, and a new generation of younger artists, led by Henri Matisse and Pablo Picasso, were challenging the achievements of Impressionism. By early 1914, French newspapers were reporting that Monet, by then 73 and one of the world's wealthiest, most celebrated painters, had retired his brushes. He had lost his beloved wife, Alice, and his eldest son, Jean. His famously acute vision--what Paul Cezanne called "the most prodigious eye in the history of painting"--was threatened by cataracts. And yet, despite ill health, self-doubt, and advancing age, Monet began painting again on a more ambitious scale than ever before. Linking great artistic achievement to the personal and historical dramas unfolding around it, Ross King presents the most intimate and revealing portrait of an iconic figure in world culture--from his lavish lifestyle and tempestuous personality to his close friendship with the fiery war leader Georges Clemenceau, who regarded the Water Lilies as one of the highest expressions of the human spirit.
