#### **Review of Artist Jill Sneidman**

#### PHOTOGRAPHY - WITVA - Fall For ART Exhibition First Place went to Jill Sneidman

#### DAY INTO NIGHT

"This is one of the nicest photographs I have ever seen, from the lighting, the almost graphic view of the water, mountains and sky coming together. Beginning at the right time on the right day, with the right equipment and the right eye of the artist who has captured this very special moment. This piece is a great example of when a photograph becomes a painting, storytelling at its best moment."

Per Jill: "This photograph was taken in Iceland at around 5:00 pm on a somewhat cloudy, overcast day. I was driving to our next town and coming down a hill

when I was faced with this view of an incredible Icelandic volcanic wonder. It was eerie and beautiful all at the same time. I had to pull over in the dirt right before I was supposed to go over a very long bridge to get to the other side. I am thrilled to have won for one of my favorite photographs."



#### **Artist Elizabeth Kuechenmeister**

This painting - "Winter Comes on Little Frost Feet" - was accepted by APBC for their "Falling Into Winter" competition. It is 10"x13" on masonite, mixed media - pencil, chalk, acrylic and oil glaze. I wanted to capture the melancholy of the twilight frost on this monumental tree.

The tree is a Weeping Beech - one of the oldest trees on Cape Cod, in Yarmouth. It is amazing to see it in person. The tree is 50 feet tall and the canopy over 60 feet wide. You can easily walk under the canopy. The tree is riddled with gnarled, intertwined branches both huge and small, which give it an almost menacing appearance when the leaves have fallen. The pendulous branches are falling or "weeping" - hence its name.

The tree has hosted engagements, weddings, memorials, and probably a first kiss or too! In the past, initials were carved in the tree. You could sit on its branches, some of which grow underground and rise again. Now, it is requested the weeping beech be respected and protected.

The title of the painting is a reflection on "Fog," the poem by Carl Sandburg in 1916. It was Sandburg's effort at haiku:

'The fog comes on little cat feet

It sits looking over harbor and city on silent haunches and then moves on'



I used soft blended strokes for the starry sky and rough choppy strokes for the tree. A warm palette of cadmium yellow pale, cadmium orange and cadmium red medium were used for the tree and the horizon as the sun gives way to twilight gloaming. The sky is a cool mixture of burnt umber and ultramarine blue.

The two gas giants - Jupiter and Saturn, hang in the November sky and were painted in titanium white, along with a sprinkling of stars.

I also have to wonder if I was -subconsciously- influenced by Georgia O'Keefe's "Lawrence Tree" with its bright red trunk and branches which was famously hung upside down in the Wadsworth Atheneum. The Lawrence Tree still flourishes at the D.H.Lawrence Ranch in Taos, N.M. ##

#### Fellowship Friday with the Artists of Palm Beach County

Every year, on the Friday after Thanksgiving, the Palm Beach Fellowship of Christians and Jews holds a day of service for organizations in our community. Opportunities to volunteer this year included beach cleanups, helping with the animals at the Peggy Adams Animal Rescue League, organizing a food pantry for the Adopt-A-Family Program, and working with single women at Lord's Place Halle Place residential facility.

For several years Sandra Thompson, long time friend of and judge for, the Artists of Palm Beach County, has organized an art experience for disabled adults and, this year, for residents of Halle House. Carole and Dan Pichney have worked on this Thanksgiving Friday Program for many years and, this Friday, helped Sandy with her project. Sandy designed a project where the women decorated flowerpots to be placed outside of their apartments at Halle House.

Sandy led the activity providing examples of what could be done to paint the flowerpots. Carole helped and Dan, a long time gardener, led the planting of the flowers into the pots. At first the women were hesitant, but under Sandy's guidance became fully engaged with the project. As you can see from the attached photos the women were all smiles and very proud of what they had accomplished. A great morning was had by all.

This is another outreach activity by the Artists of Palm Beach County members, and we hope to continue to support this and many other artistic activities in our community. Next Thanksgiving Friday, instead of going shopping or sleeping off your turkey dinner, join us as we do another worthwhile project.

#### Artists of Palm Beach County Strategic Outreach Alliance With Northend RISE

Over the past year, APBC has been working for form an alliance with Northend RISE, a community project affiliated with Purpose Built Communities, a national initiative founded by philanthropist Warren Buffett and others. Northend RISE is one of only two neighborhoods in Florida and one of 25 neighborhoods in the United States to be chosen to participate with the Purpose Built network. It was chosen based on the resources available to, and the commitment of, this community. Its plan is to restore forgotten neighborhoods at a family and systems level to improve the quality of life in the community. The pillars it is built on include mixed-income housing, cradle-to-career educational opportunities, and community wellness. RISE stands for Respect, Integrity, Strength Equals Equity.

I urge you to go to both websites, <u>purposebuiltcommunities.org</u>, and <u>northendrise.org</u> to understand the impact this program can have on a community. APBC has coordinated two art workshops at RISE, thanks to the generosity of APBC member Lupe Lawrence. Lupe's first class was held this summer, and her latest Holiday Card Workshop drew 17 members of the community. Please see the accompanying photos which show the success of this latest workshop.

Thanks to the generosity of, and in coordination with, The Diversity and Inclusion Council of Lake Park, APBC facilitated the provision of 15 Thanksgiving turkey dinners for members of this neighborhood, mostly seniors, who did not have transportation to pick up the food. Mikeal Maddison of RISE personally picked up the turkeys in Lake Park and in the pouring rain managed to safely deliver them to the families.

We hope to plan several events in 2023 in our strategic alliance with RISE in a program called RISE with ART!.
