It without a doubt the most well attended events we have ever had, which also translates into our most successful for sales as well. Estimated attendance was about 300 per event and sales totaling close to \$4,000. The diversity of art was stunning from a handmade book (\$50/sold: by Sarah

Mayo) to a bronze sculpture of a crow, other crows on tiles (Look Who's Talking \$140/sold by Karla Walter) to an abstract Blue Forest (\$1,250/sold by Judith Smith). Our first place prizewinner, ceramic artist Heather had two original installations in the show and our judge, Jessica Ransom, Director of Artist Services for the Palm Beach County Cultural Council chose one as our winner! Our hosts for the event, Rod and David, opened their antique-filled home and fountain-filled gardens for a dreamy backdrop for our 30 plus artists' work and installations.

If you feel your paintings look amateurish, or if you feel your cheap paint is holding you back, then invest in artist quality paints. They make a difference.



EXPERIENCE TOWERING EXPRESSIVE WORKS WITH ETHEARD JOSEPH EXHIBITION 'INFINITE EXISTENCE' AT CULTURAL COUNCIL FOR PALM BEACH COUNTY

Large-scale paintings in vibrant colors convey artist's emotions, thoughts and dreams

March 2, 2023 (Lake Worth Beach, Fla.) — Jupiter-based Professional Artist Etheard Joseph wants to draw visitors into his universe with his immersive work.

In a stunning exhibition of distinctive large-scale abstract paintings that will soon be on display at the Cultural Council for Palm Beach County, he hopes to do just that.

An exhibition of Joseph's work will take place March 17 through April 29 in the Cultural Council's Solo Gallery at its downtown Lake Worth Beach headquarters. Free and open to the public, exhibition hours are Tuesday through Saturday from noon to 5 p.m.



A multidisciplinary artist, Joseph's artistic work includes assemblage, collage, illustration, painting, photography, videography and sculptural work, but this exhibition — titled *Infinite Existence* — will focus on his sweeping, expressive paintings. Painted in vivid colors that convey his emotions, thoughts and dreams, Joseph uses his own lexicon of shapes, colors and hidden symbols to communicate through abstract images.

"Etheard's work is bright and colorful, and his energy and personality shine through in his work," said Jessica Ransom, the Cultural Council's director of artist services and curator of the exhibition. "His paintings are vibrant, enthralling and immersive due to the large scale."

Selected through a highly competitive application process, Joseph is one of six Palm Beach County professional artists whose work was chosen by a committee for a coveted Solo Gallery exhibition.

After building a successful art career in New York, Joseph relocated to The Palm Beaches in 2021 and quickly developed a following. In addition to exhibitions across the nation, his work has been seen regionally in the Cultural Council's 2022 exhibition *Gatherings*, as well as at Boynton Beach's City Hall, the New Studio For The Visual Arts in Jupiter, ArtsWarehouse in Delray Beach and the All Florida Juried Art Show in Stuart presented by MartinArts. His work has also been seen at the Armory Faculty Show at the Armory Art Center in West Palm Beach, where he teaches photography workshops.

"I'm so honored to have my first solo show at the Cultural Council for Palm Beach County," Joseph said. "The body of work in *Infinite Existence* examines the idea that we are all infinite and everywhere. It's about asking why we are here and where and how we fit in. Are there other universes where we could also exist? If so, what would we look like?"

For each of his paintings, Joseph focuses on an individual thought, dream or question and selects shapes and colors that reflect his feelings. He paints on large canvases because he has so much to say, and often paints with brushes, his bare hands and other tools. He infuses meaning into every section of each painting, with sizes that run as large as 6 feet by 15 feet wide.

"Each painting is a story, and some stories have to be told big," he said. "Ultimately, when a viewer is looking at one of my large-scale paintings, I want them to forget everything else. I want the viewer to experience all of the things I was thinking about when I was creating the painting."

A popular presence throughout the arts scene in The Palm Beaches, Joseph is the creator and host of the <u>ArtISts ConnectingSouth Florida Project</u>, a bi-weekly YouTube show highlighting creative people across South Florida.

Etheard Joseph: Infinite Existence will run from March 17 through April 29 at the Council's headquarters in Lake Worth Beach. Hours are Tuesday through Saturday from noon to 5 p.m. Admission is free. Visit palmbeachculture.com/exhibitions for more information or to register for the opening artist reception on Thursday, March 16, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.




THE ART OF READING:

"A dazzling novel of one of America's most celebrated photographers--exploring Dorothea Lange's wild years in San Francisco that awakened her career-defining grit, compassion, and daring. In 1918 her friendship with Caroline Lee gives her entrée into Monkey Block, an artists' colony and the bohemian heart of San Francisco. She falls in love with Maynard Dixon, a brilliant but troubled painter. Dorothea and Caroline eventually create a flourishing portrait studio only to have a devastating betrayal push their friendship to the breaking point and alter the course of their lives. Rich with descriptions of San Francisco in the glittering and gritty 1920s, and with cameos from such legendary figures as Mabel Dodge, Frida Kahlo, Ansel Adams, and DH Lawrence, The Bohemians explores the gift of friendship, the possibility of self-invention, and the ferocious pull of history"—
