Tip of the month

Not all paper is created equally! If you're going to paint in watercolors, it is essential for you to use actual watercolor paper. Copy paper isn't made in the same way as watercolor paper and will result in a buckled, wavy wash. The copy paper also pills, meaning the fibers start to tear and ball up on the sheet. The watercolor paper is heavier weight and has an additive allowing it to absorb moisture .

MARCH 16TH ART SALON

We had a great turnout at the RISE Community Resource center on March 16 with about 25 people in attendance. Three of our members; Barbara Powell, Heather Couch and Karla Walter presented samples of their work, explained how they became interested in ceramics, and talked about their creative process.

It was a fascinating talk even for those of us who entered knowing nothing about ceramics. We learned about throwing clay, the wheel, and various types of glazes. How horse and human hair, feathers and other natural materials are used to create designs. Also, how the temperature in the kiln is usually over 1,500 degrees. We also learned that in some instances 40-50% of items being fired are discarded because they break or aren't perfect. It gave us a whole new appreciation for ceramic arts. It was a fun, educational afternoon.

DAYTIME ART SALON IN DOWNTOWN WEST PALM BEACH

On March 20th, Artists of Palm Beach County presented its first daytime art salon at the Palm Beach Photographic Center on Clematis Street. Susan Currie organized the salon, and its first guest speaker was Dr. Lali Shanker.

Dr. Shanker is a member of APBC and resides in Toronto in the summer and Singer Island during the winter months. The title of her presentation was *Blurred Vision: Navigating The Brush Strokes.* Dr. Shanker is a radiologist, and she explained how various diseases of the eye can affect the work of artists. Renoir had myopia and limited distance vision, which she feels was responsible for his blurred backgrounds. Cézanne had diabetes, Turner color blindness. Mary Cassatt had macular disease and cataracts, and Degas had macular disease, which made him lose his central vision. He also had extreme light sensitivity and could not paint outside. Monet had cataracts toward the end of his life and painted in very dull browns and oranges. Once his cataracts were removed he once again saw and painted bright colors.

The presentation was fascinating and 26 people were in attendance. Susan Currie plans to hold a second daytime salon sometime in April, and the information will be posted on our website.




