SPONSOR A STUDENT

Would you consider supporting a young artist's academic trip to Paris? I have put together a course abroad proposal for the students of Palm Beach Atlantic University to study art history once a week in the classroom here in West Palm, and then to travel for one week to Paris to visit the great works of art in person. We will visit some of the greatest museums in the world, such as The Louvre Museum, The Musée d'Orsay, the Centre Pompidou, and the Palace of Versailles, to name a few. They will write analysis papers, comparative essays, and keep a journal of their experiences. Upon return, they will choose one work of art or style to further study, and they will create a presentation on this work. While in Paris, we will also have the opportunity to meet with local artists, attend gallery openings, visit monuments, and experience the history and culture of the city. I believe this will be a lifechanging experience for these young art students. Would you consider partnering with me in making this happen for them?

I kept the cost as low as I could, given the needs of the trip and safety perimeters of the university. It is \$3000 for each student. I have three art students that are very dedicated and talented that were on the fence about going because of the financial stress of taking this bill on. These three have each committed, having decided that it will be worth it to them no matter the cost. I would LOVE to be able to help them out.

Give Yourself a Gift! Volunteer Very Little Time Commitment Necessary



National Alliance for the Mentally Ill Card Making Workshop, Lake Worth

On December 10, APBC volunteers Cyndi George and Sharon Gregory led a holiday card making workshop for members of NAMI, the National Alliance for the Mentally III at their drop in center in Lake Worth.

Sixteen people shared pizza, holiday music, and art for a glitter filled party. Ages ranged from late teens to 80 years old. Cyndi and Sharon planned the event and shopped for stickers, cotton balls, stencils, canvas covered boards, and lots and lots of glitter. People came early and stayed late and thoroughly enjoyed the experience and the celebration of both Christmas and Chanukah. One person said she was happy to lose track of time through her creativity and art. One gentleman drew a reindeer in perfect perspective next to a Santa Clause that was not in perspective. Cyndi said she learned much through watching him draw.

HEATHER COUCH



HEATHER COUCH ACCUMULATIONS August 21 – October 7, 2023

Heather Couch was a featured artist at the Coral Springs Museum of Art with her exhibition titled "Accumulations," showcasing selected work from the past 10 years together with her newest pieces and a site-specific installation of precarious structures built of wood, supporting fragile ceramic sculptures and soft wool to create an environment of warm and peaceful instability.

Artist Statement:

A soft and fragile knowing leads us to exploration, uncertainty, and open-ended creativity. My work routinely celebrates that uncertainty, with a warmth and spontaneity that embraces process and moving through. Precarious, fragile, and standing still for a moment, these pieces are composed and revised at each step of their making. Structures bend or dance in fragile tension with the material, while closed forms hold layers of texture that crack and crawl with their physical properties. Chance is here often given the pedestal. Repeated marks of the artist's thumb pressing into soft clay revisit the intensely personal nature of the work, the process, and the labor of making. These abstract forms are derived from narratives of the artist's experience, reflecting on psychology and emotion, through progression from one piece to the next, and from observation of the larger environment. Informed by landscapes and cultures, they are reflections on the tensions of juggling multiple systems at once. Juxtapositions of material, color, personality and form provide an ongoing series of investigation. With overlaps of discrepancy and a playful use of material, this work explores resiliency in the moving through.

HEATHER COUCH

Artist Bio:

Heather Couch is an Assistant Professor of Art at Palm Beach Atlantic University in West Palm Beach, Florida. Heather received an MFA in Fine Art / Ceramics in 2015 from Arizona State University. She works in sculptural ceramics and mixed media installation, composing with material language to form pieces that reflect on tensions of uncertainty. Heather earned a B.A. in Sculpture at Union University in Jackson, Tennessee, followed by continued study in ceramics at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts, Alfred University, Chautauqua School of Art in New York, and Hong Ik University in Seoul, South Korea. Recent exhibitions include "On This Day" at CRETA Rome in Rome, Italy, "Static/Not Static" at The Peach Arts District in West Palm Beach, and "Composing Texture" at the University of Dallas in Texas. Heather has been a resident artist at CRETA Rome in Rome Italy, the Armory Art Center in West Palm Beach Florida, the International Ceramics Studio in Kecskemet Hungary, and the Mesa Arts Center in Mesa Arizona. Her work can be found in private and public collection including Florida Gulf Coast University, Union University, and the Mesa Contemporary Art Museum (MCA).





Warrior Dog: The True Story of a Navy SEAL and His Fearless Canine Partner (DB114541)

Reading time: 4 hours, 50 minutes GENRES: Biography; War and the Military; Animals and Wildlife "When Will Chesney became a Navy SEAL, he never imagined working with dogs. But when he was introduced to Cairo, a Belgian Malinois, they became close immediately. Will and Cairo started working together, side by side, depending on each other for survival in hundreds of critical operations. Soon their bond went beyond military service to true friendship. As Will moved on to other assignments, he saw Cairo less and less. Then, in 2011, the call came: Pick up your dog and get back to Virginia. Now, Cairo and Will trained for weeks, but it soon became clear that this was no ordinary mission. Cairo was among the first members of the US military on the ground in Pakistan as part of Operation Neptune Spear, which resulted in the successful elimination of Osama bin Laden. After the mission, Will went back to his job, until 2013, when a grenade blast left him severely injured. Now it was up to Cairo to save Will's life once more -- and then up to Will to be there when Cairo needed him the most."
